## ART PURCHASES HELP SAVE THE VANISHING PRAIRIE

KANSAS CITY, MO, SEPTEMBER 23, 2015: The opening of the 7th Annual Visions of the Flint Hills Benefit and Sale is set for First Friday, October 2, 2015, from 6:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m., at the Buttonwood Art Space, 3013 Main, Kansas City, Missouri. The gallery exhibition includes a 153 artworks by 58 artists all derived from and inspired by the Flint Hills of Kansas and the Great Plains. Once covering over 750 million acres, the Flint Hills represent the last expanse of intact tallgrass prairie in the nation and the best opportunity for sustained preservation of this unique habitat that once covered the Great Plains.

Purchases of art during this exhibit will benefit the research education and preservation of this unique ecosystem. A portion of the sale price compensates the artists for their beautiful art with the remainder going to the Friends of Konza Prairie organization as a charitable donation.

The Visions of the Flint Hills Benefit and Sale runs from October 2nd through November 27th, 2015, and net proceeds from the event will benefit the Friends of the Konza Prairie, a non-profit organization. Located in the Flint Hills of northeastern Kansas, approximately six miles south of the City of Manhattan, the Konza Prairie Biological Station is an 8,600-acre native tallgrass prairie preserve owned by The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and Kansas State University (KSU). Operated as a field research station by the K-State Division of Biology, Konza Prairie is dedicated to a three-fold mission of long-term ecological research, education, and prairie conservation. Diane Barker, current President of Friends of Konza Prairie, states, "That three-fold mission of research, education, and conservation is vitally important, but you can't really understand the passion that drives those activities until you see the art the Flint Hills inspires. When an artist hauls canvas, paint and an easel out to paint a stretch of grass and sky, an intimacy is created that

takes on a life of its own. When a photographer chases a fire at night to catch the bright necklace circling a hill, that devotion to capturing how people relate to their land enriches our understanding. This is a great show because it celebrates not only beauty but an enduring dependence all people have on the place that shelters and feeds them. Come celebrate this unique landscape and help us protect it for future generations."
